
The Unified Patent Court: an opportunity to enforce patents all across the EU

Previously...

- A European (EP) patent could only be enforced or revoked before national courts.
- A decision of a national court only covered the part of the EP patent that concerned the relevant Member State.
- To enforce an EP patent in Europe, multiple national proceedings must be started.
- Only an opposition before the EPO could cover all parts of the EP patent at the same time, but the availability of these proceedings were time-limited (within nine months from the grant) and only concerned validity.

- UP is subject to the exclusive iurisdiction of the UPC from the start date.
- At the start, a transitional period (seven years) gives classic EP patent owners the option to choose between national courts and the UPC.

Centralising European patent disputes

Main features

- Cross-border injunctions and damages covering up to 24 countries in single court proceedings.
- Central revocation covering up to 24 countries.

Speed

 The UPC intends to be faster than most national courts (target: decision within 12 months).

Cost-efficiency

- One court fee.
- · Only one set of legal costs.

Predictability

- UPC judges experienced nationally and with specialist training.

• The UPC system has not been tested yet.
